Squadding:	All matches, including team matches, will be squadded by the Statistical Office. Competitor squadding assignments for advance entries and post entries on Friday, May 14 will be posted on the Statistical Office bulletin board by 8 AM on Saturday, May 15. Squadding assignments for all other entries will be made at time of registration and an updated squadding assignment sheet will be posted on the Statistical Office bulletin board as soon thereafter as is practical. Team squadding assignments will be announced on the range and posted on the Statistical Office bulletin board.				
	It is each competitor's and team's responsibility to verify their squadding assignment. Failure of an individual (or team member) to present himself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event.

- Class & Category: Class and category awards will be determined by the number of entries in each. Up to four categories may be used: Service, Civilian, Senior and Junior. Classes/categories with insufficient entries will be combined for awards. Members of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, National Guard and Reserve components will comprise the Service Category (Rules 2.5, 2.6 and 2.7). All others are either Civilians (Rule 2.2), Seniors (Rule 2.2.1) or Juniors (Rule 2.3).
- Any Sight-Only 3200 Match No. 12: A special Any Sight-Only 3200 class is available to competitors who wish to shoot with telescopic sights both days. A special awards formula will be used for this class based on the total number of entries. A minimum of 5 entries is required to establish a class for award purposes and such a group is not eligible for any of the open tournament awards, except within their group and for the any sight portion of the match program.
- Targets:Official NRA Conventional targets will be used: A-23/5 at 50 yards, A-25 at 100 yards, and A-26 at 50
meters. Competitors will mark and hang their own targets before each match stage. Target clips are
required and must be furnished by each competitor. Targets will be scored by the Statistical Office
staff under the supervision of the Chief Statistical Office.
- **Challenges:** Challenges and protests will be addressed as described in Rule 16. A \$2.00 challenge fee will be charged for each challenge and collected by the Statistical Office before making the first recheck. The fee will be returned if the challenge is sustained at any point along the line of rechecks. Challenge time limits for each match will be posted on the Statistical Office bulletin board.

<u>Scoring Of Challenged Shots And Shots Of Questionable Value</u>: In this tournament, the plug type scoring gauge will be restricted to use by range operating personnel including range officers, chief statistical officer, and one or more of the three members of the jury who will be selected prior to firing time. Competitors may not use a scoring plug under any circumstance.

Team Regional Championship Award – Match No. 12, 2-Man Team Championship – An NRA team medal will be awarded to each member of the winning team.

Souvenir Pins: An NRA Regional Championship souvenir pin will be given to each competitor.

NRA National Smallbore Rifle Championship Certificate Award: Certificates for 50% off Camp Perry entry fees will be awarded to winners of each class with at least 10 competitors. Only one certificate will be awarded per class of 10 or more. Classes may be combined upward (NRA Rule 9.8.1) to make a class of 10 competitors. No certificates will be awarded if there are fewer than ten total competitors entered in this Regional tournament.

Competitors may earn a maximum of one prone certificate and one position certificate per year. Both certificates may be applied to the National Smallbore Rifle Championships if the certificate winner competes in both championships. Certificates won by an ineligible competitor will be passed down to the next lower competitor in that class (e.g., if the class winner has already won a prone certificate at an earlier Regional prone tournament or is a supported shooter). Certificates awarded to competitors remain the property of the NRA which may refuse to honor any certificate for any reason at anytime,

Awards Furnished by River Bend Gun Club:

<u>Class and category</u> winners of individual fired matches and unfired aggregate matches (other than junior competitors) will receive cash awards. The value of awards will determined by an award schedule designed to equitably distribute awards to competitors based on the number of entries in each class and category. The total amount of funds available for awards distribution will be approximately 60% of total receipts less tournament expenses (NRA registration fees, RBGC range fee, target costs, etc.).

Schedule Of Awards:

Awards Furnished by River Bend Gun Club: (Continued)

A minimum of 5 entries is required to form a class/category and receive awards. Second place awards will be presented with 8 or more entries in a class/category. Third place awards will be presented with 13 or more entries in a class/category. Class/categories with insufficient entries to meet the minimum entry criterion will be promoted to a higher class (Rule 19.8.1).

"Odd Ball" Team Match - Match No. 12

In an attempt to encourage and stimulate team match participation, the 2-man team match is a "fun event" with teams assigned by the sponsor as explained below. The match sponsor is hopeful that all individual competitors will join the fun.

- Eligibility: This is an "open" team match and there is no club or organizational affiliation requirement. <u>Teams</u> <u>are not eligible to establish NRA national records</u>.
- **Entry:** The team match is a sponsored event and there is no team entry fee for competitors. <u>Competitors may</u> <u>enter the team match by notifying the Statistical Office before the start of Match 1</u>, Dewar Match Metallic Sight.
- Awards: Each member of the winning team will receive an NRA team medal. If more eight or more teams compete, a medal will be awarded to each member of the second place team.
- **Course Of Fire:** The Odd Ball team match is an Any Sight 400 aggregate match with 20 shots for record fired by each team member. The distance will be 50 yards fired on target A23/5. A three minute preparation period will be followed by twenty minutes for unlimited fouling and/or sighting shots and twenty shots for record.

The highest possible team score is 400-40X. Ties will be broken per Section 15 of NRA Smallbore Rifle Rules.

Team Assignment: The sponsor will assign teams from the roster of individual competitors who register to compete in the team match. Team assignments will be made based on the scores fired in the Dewar Match Metallic Sight (Match No. 1) as follows:

Team competitors will be ranked-ordered from high to low based on their score in Match No. 1, Metallic Sight Dewar Match. The competitor with the highest score in Match No. 1 will be teamed with the competitor with the lowest score in Match No. 1. The competitor with the second highest score will be teamed with the competitor with the second lowest score and so on until all competitors are assigned to teams.

- The "Odd Ball": If an odd number of individual competitors register for the team match, the "odd ball" (individual without an assigned team member) will be given the option of accepting a stipend in lieu of competing or competing with all other teams plus firing a supplemental 20 minute/20-record shot stage at the conclusion of the team match. If the "odd ball" declines the stipend and elects to compete in the team match, he or she may recruit a <u>non-firing teammate/coach</u> if such person is readily available. If the "odd ball" wins the team match or is eligible for a second place award, the non-firing teammate/coach will be awarded a team medal.
- Squadding: Team members will be squadded on adjacent firing points to facilitate team member communication and coaching. Firing points will be assigned by the Statistical Office and will be available when the team assignments are announced.
