Location: CMP North Competition Center, Camp Perry, OH

Eligibility: All junior shooters are welcome.

Team Eligibility: Sporter and Precision Rifle teams will be made of 4 competitors (one of whom must be designated Team Captain) and a coach. Teams must choose one category from the following in which to compete:

Local Club Team
State Association Team- must have the proper form (found at the end of this document) designating them the official state association team
School Team
Military Scholastic Team

Entries: Entry Fee will be \$50 for rifle teams and \$25 for individuals. This fee will be due at the time of entry, either by credit card or check. If a team or participant does not attend the match, 50% of entry fee will be returned. Deadline for entry is **June 1, 2011**. On-line registration will be available April 6. Paper registration forms can be found at the end of this program and should be sent to:

Entries may be limited due to the number of points and relays available, and will be assigned on a "first come, first served" basis. Each shooter and coach must complete a photograph release and a hometown news media data sheet by the time of check-in. These can be found at the end of this program.

Coaches who show or include a copy of their current National Rifle Association/USA Shooting/Civilian Marksmanship Program coaching card will qualify for a \$15 discount valid for one individual entry <u>or</u> one team entry.

Check-in and Practice: Official Check-in for all competitors will take place at Petrarca Range Thursday, June 23, from 8:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M. Equipment inspection will take place during check-in. Practice relays will also be available beginning at 8:00 A.M., 10:00 A.M., 12 P.M., 2 P.M. Participants may choose when they would like to practice and space will be available on a "first come, first serve" basis. Participants will be allowed to practice before they checkin, however be aware that registration will close at 3 P.M.

Rules: Current NRA Sporter Air Rifle Position Rules and NRA Precision Air Rifle Position Rules will govern, except where otherwise noted in this Program. Rulebooks are available at http://www.nrahq.org/compete/nra-rule-books.asp. Competitors are required to wear their competitor number while on the line and use CBIs.

Squadding: Teams are allowed to request squadding prior to check-in. However, the Match Staff will make the final decision regarding squadding. Tentative squadding will be given out at check-in and final squadding will be given at the Coaches and Competitors Meeting. Relays will not be the same on the two competition days. Every effort will be made to squad team members together, unless otherwise specified.

Mandatory Coaches and Competitors Meeting: Thursday, June 23, 4:30 P.M. Coaches and participants must attend this meeting concerning range operation procedures, scoring, challenges, and other items. Any questions will be addressed at this time and the match staff will be introduced. Coaches and competitors are responsible for knowledge of information, notes, policies, and procedures presented, whether in attendance or not.

Coaching: Coaching of any kind is forbidden while the competitor is on the firing line.

Challenges: Administrative challenges will be accepted up to one our after scores are posted. One hour after results are posted, ALL RESULTS ARE FINAL.

Compressed Air and CO₂: Compressed air and CO₂ tanks will be available at the range. Teams and participants are responsible for bringing their own adapters. Cylinders will be filled in the designated areas only.

Training: Training Summit classes are not mandatory. There will be door prizes for those in attendance.

The NRA's National Air Gun Team will also be selected during this match. The top 14 shooters in Sporter and the top 14 shooters in Precision from Match 4 (Day 1) will make up this National Team. The scores these selected competitors shoot in Match 8 (Day 2) will be the scores used in the NRA's US-South African Postal Match. These competitors will be recognized during the Awards Ceremony. Awards Ceremony: The Awards Ceremony will take place on Saturday, June 25, at 8:00 p.m. at the Hough Theatre. Participants must attend the Awards Banquet dressed appropriately. Appropriate dress is slacks, dress shirts, skirts, dresses, and official team uniforms. Mixed training suits, T-shirts, shorts, or jeans are not appropriate attire for the Awards Ceremony.

Reimbursement: Teams traveling 1000 miles or more may be compensated for some of their travel expenses after the event and after the correct paperwork is completed. Travel will be reimbursed based on the following guidelines:

- The sponsoring Club's address must be 1,000 miles or more from Camp Perry (according to Google Maps)
- Completed forms (can be found at the end of this program) along with ALL required receipts must be sent to NRA HQ and be postmarked by Monday, August 8, 2011. Requests will not be accepted after this deadline.

Responsibility: Proper behavior is expected at all times. Team sponsors and coaches are responsible for their shooters and chaperones. Courtesy toward the match staff, sponsors, CMP and Camp Perry staff/employees, and other teams is expected from all participants, including a team's supporting staff (parents, siblings, etc.) at all times.

Safety: Coaches are responsible for the safe handling of their air guns at and away from the range.

Coaches, shooters, and staff will monitor safe gun handling while at the range. All individuals at the range are responsible to ensure that safe gun handling procedures are followed at all times. CBIs will be passed out at Registration and participants will be required to use them whenever on the range and not shooting.

Housing: Contact Camp Perry Housing at 888-889-7010 for on-base accommodations. Modules have 2 single beds and will cost \$79.02 per night. Huts have 4 beds and will cost \$43.90 per night.

- > <u>Sponsors:</u> South African National Schools Shooting Union, National Rifle Association Air Gun Program, and other invited countries.
- Location: USA participation Camp Perry, OH
- ➤ <u>Who:</u> Air rifle shooters attending their respective country's championship who are members of his or her respective country's shooting organization. All shooters must not have turned 21 years of age by the postal match.
- > Rules: NRA Precision and Sporter Air Rifle Rule Books will govern.
- ➤ Course of Fire: 60-shot aggregate match with 20 shots each in the Prone, Standing, and Kneeling positions in Sporter and in Precision.
- ➤ <u>Team Structure:</u> 14 junior team members will be selected in each discipline (Sporter and Precision). The 13th place shooter will be the Team Captain and the 14th place shooter will be the Team Coach. The top 12 shooters' scores will be the score of the team.
- Results: Will be scored by the match statistical staff and verified by the Chief Statistical Officer. The results will be electronically submitted to each governing organization and timely published in appropriate results bulletins and other publications as available.

National Team Selection Process: At the end of Match 4, the top 14 shooters in Sporter and Precision will be selected to compete on the International Postal Team. Scores from Match 8 will be used for the International Postal. The top 12 shooters will make up the team score. The 13th shooter from Match 4 will be asked to be the Team Captain and the 14th shooter will be asked to be the Team Coach. Each participant will receive a team jacket. Results will be posted on the results webpage.
