Location: RBGC is approximately 60 road miles north of downtown Atlanta in the southwest corner of Dawson County, 15 miles from Dawsonville, GA. The GPS coordinates of RBGC are: **N34 20.198 W084 14.819** For driving directions to the club, please refer to the interactive map on our web site at www.rbgc.org. Facilities: The competition forum, RBGC's Multi-purpose Range No. 2 (MP2), has 40 paved and covered firing points.

RV parking is permitted at MP2 and the club also has a pleasant area designated for camping. Clean rest rooms and a limited number of RV water and electric hook-ups are also available at MP2. Modern showers are also available on the club grounds.

If you plan to park an RV, camp out or practice at River Bend Gun Club, please contact the match director or Club Manager before you unload your camping or competition equipment.

Please Note - All competitors must sign an RBGC liability release *before* practicing and/or competing. Liability releases for junior competitors must be signed by an adult guardian. Liability release forms will be available at the range. RBGC guests are limited to use of the MP2 range only during open practice or competition while a member of the match staff is present.

Lodging: Lodging accommodations are conveniently located within a reasonable driving distance of the range in Cumming, Canton, Dawsonville and Gainesville. Please see the lodging listings on our web site at www.rbgc.org. From the home page click on "Club Information" and then click on "Nearby Motels and Restaurants".

Food & Beverage: There are no restaurant facilities at RBGC or conveniently nearby and we recommend that you bring lunch, drinks, and a snack.

Rules: Current NRA Smallbore Rifle Rules will govern. The .22 Caliber Rimfire Rifle as defined in NRA Smallbore Rifle Rules 3.2 (Any Rifle) applies. Per Rule 3.21, the requirement for a smallbore empty chamber indicator (ECI) to indicate that the chamber is empty will be strictly enforced.

As provided in NRA rules, this is a simultaneous dual championship tournament in which a paper match Conventional State Championship will use the Regional Championship scores of Georgia residents who register to compete for the state championship to crown the 2011 NRA Smallbore Rifle Prone Conventional State Champion.

Eligibility: The 2nd Annual "Half-Perry" Smallbore Rifle Prone Championships is open to all competitors and there are membership requirements.

Teams: Entries will be accepted at the Statistical Office any time before the firing of the Team Match. Teams will comprise two (2) firing members, representing a club affiliated with the NRA; a State Association; a Regular Service unit; a Reserve unit (including the National Guard); or a law enforcement agency Rules 2.11, 2.12, 2.13 or 2.14 respectively. Pick-up teams will be permitted to fire but will not be eligible for team awards. Unaffiliated teams may fire but will not be eligible for awards or NRA national records,

Entries: **Individual Entries:** Individual entries may be made by completing and submitting the registration entry form at the rear of this match program, accompanied by a check or money order made payable to Tommy Steadman in the amount of the total entry fees (do not send cash with entries submitted by mail). SR-1 Card: SR-1 card is not required provided a complete and correct entry form is submitted.

Entries Close: Individual match entries must be received no later than July 3, 2012.

Entries Limited: Entries are limited to 80 individual competitors. Team entries are limited to twenty 2-man teams.

Advance entries will be accepted up to range capacity based on earliest postmarks. Entries beyond range capacity will be notified by e-mail or telephone on or about July 5.

Post Entries: Post entries will be accepted up to the stated range capacity. There is no additional fee for post entries but advance entries are appreciated.

Return of Fees: Advance entry fees will be fully refunded to any competitor unable to attend.

Squadding: All matches, including team matches, will be squadded by the Statistical Office. All competitors must check-in at the Statistical Office to obtain assignments.

Squadding Preference Will Be Given To Full Program Entries.

Classification: The NRA classification system will be used in all individual matches. Individual competitors without an NRA classification will fire in the Master Class. Rule 19.6 (assigned classification) or Rule 19.2 (temporary classification) may be used.

Post entries (or advance entries whose NRA classification could not be verified online) may be asked to present NRA classification cards at time of registration.

Any Sight 2400: Individual competitors may shoot any sights both days and thus compete in a separate any sight group. Awards will be per a special any sight award schedule. A minimum of five competitors is required to receive Any Sight Group awards and this group is not eligible for any of the Metallic Sight 1200 class or open awards (matches 1 through 4) awards or Regional 2400 Aggregate Open awards (match 9). Competitors in the Any Sight 2400 group will be eligible for awards only within the any sight group (subject to group size criteria) and for the any sight portion of the program [matches 5 through 8].

Targets: Official NRA Conventional targets will be used: Target A 23/5 at 50 yards, target A 26 at 50 meters and target A 25 at 100 yards. Competitors will mark and hang their own targets before each match stage. Target clips are required and must be furnished by each competitor. Targets will be scored by the Statistical Office staff under the supervision of the Chief Statistical Officer. Scored targets will be available for inspection by competitors in the Statistical Office.

Challenges: Challenges and protests will be addressed as described in Rule 16. A \$2.00 challenge fee will be required for each challenge on a competitor's own target and a \$5 challenge fee required on each challenge of another competitor's target. Challenge fees will be collected by the Statistical Office before making the first recheck. The challenge fee will be returned if the challenge is sustained at any point along the line of rechecks.

Scoring Of Challenged Shots And Shots Of Questionable Value: In this tournament, the plug type scoring gauge will be restricted to use by range operating personnel including range officers, chief statistical officer, and one or more of the three members of the jury who will be selected prior to firing time.

Schedule Of Awards:

Open and Class Winners of the 2400 grand aggregate match (Match No. 9) will receive a medal in recognition of their achievement per the award schedule below (no cash awards).

A 2nd place Open medal will be offered in tournaments with 15 or more total entries.

A 3rd place Open medal will be awarded in tournaments with 25 or more total entries.

A minimum of 5 entries is required to form a class/category.

A 2nd place class medal will be awarded in classes with 8 or more entries in a class.

A 3rd place class medal will be awarded in classes with 15 or more entries.

Competitors in classes with insufficient entries to meet the minimum entry criterion will be moved to a higher class (Rule 19.8.1).

A 1st place team medal will be awarded to each member of the winning team if the number of teams entered is three or more.

A 2nd place team medal will be awarded to each member of the second place team if the number of teams entered is at least five.
