Location:

RBGC is approximately 60 road miles north of downtown Atlanta in the southwest corner of Dawson County, 15 miles from Dawsonville, GA. Facilities:

The competition venue is the Mark Skutle Range (formerly MP2), which has 46 paved and covered firing points with ample parking.

RV parking is permitted at Skutle Range and the club also has a pleasant nearby area designated for camping. Clean rest rooms and a limited number of RV water and electric hook-ups are also available at a cost of \$10 per night. RV fees may be paid upon registration or competitor check-in.

Please Note - All competitors must sign an RBGC liability release <u>before</u> using club facilities. Liability releases for junior competitors must be signed by an adult guardian. Also, please remember that RBGC non-member guests are limited to use of Skutle Range only during tournaments when the match staff is present. Should you need to use Skutle Range or any other range or club facility when the match staff is not present, club rules require that guests be signed-in and accompanied by an RBGC member in good standing. Please direct any questions about these requirements to Tommy Steadman, the match staff, or the RBGC club manager.

Lodging:

Lodging accommodations are conveniently located within a reasonable driving distance of the range in Cumming, Canton, Dawsonville and Gainesville. Please see the lodging listings on our web site at www.rbgc.org. From the home page click on "Club Information" and then click on "Nearby Motels and Restaurants".

Food & Beverage: There are no snack or restaurant facilities at RBGC or nearby and we recommend that you bring lunch, drinks, and a snack.

Rules:

Current NRA Smallbore Rifle Rules will govern. The .22 Caliber Rimfire Rifle as defined in NRA Smallbore Rifle Rules 3.2 (Any Rifle) applies. Per Rule 3.21, the requirement for a smallbore empty chamber indicator (ECI) to indicate that the chamber is empty will be strictly enforced.

Eligibility:

Georgia residents must be a member of Georgia Sport Shooting Association (GSSA) and non-residents must be a member of the NRA-affiliated state association of their respective state of residence. Membership in the NRA is not required. If not a member of GSSA, junior competitors may be members of the NRA or a member of an NRA-affiliated club.

Competitors may join GSSA at the statistical office prior to the tournament.

Entries Close: Advance match entries must be received no later than September 17.

Entries Limited: Entries are limited to 46 individual competitors.

Post Entries: Post entries will be accepted up to the stated range capacity. There is no

Squadding:

All competitors will be squadded by the Statistical Office. Competitors must check-in at the Statistical Office to obtain squadding assignments. Failure of a competitor to present him- or herself at the proper firing point when his relay is called may lose his right to compete in that event. Post entries (or advance entries whose NRA classification could not be verified online) may be asked

to present NRA classification cards at time of registration.

Squadding Preference Will Be Given To Full Program Entries

Classification:

The NRA classification system will be used in all individual matches. Individual competitors without an NRA classification will fire in the Master Class. Rule 19.6 (assigned classification) or Rule 19.2

(temporary classification) may be used in making entry in an NRA Regional Tournament.

Class & Category: Separate awards will be given in each of three categories, Service, Civilian and Junior, subject to Regional Award schedule. Members of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, National Guard and Reserve components will comprise the Service Category (Rules 2.5, 2.6 and 2.7). All others are either Civilians (Rule 2.2) or Juniors (Rule 2.3). Classes and categories may be

combined (Rule 19.8).

Any Sight-Only Competitors:

Senior competitors and others may, at their option, compete with telescopic sights throughout the tournament and thus compete in a separate Any Sight-only group. Awards will be calculated per the schedule of awards below. A minimum of five (5) Any Sight-Only competitors is required to form an Any Sight-Only category. Competitors in the Any Sight-Only category are eligible for awards within the Any Sight-Only category only. If there are there are fewer than five Any Sight-Only competitors, the Any Sight-Only competitors will eligible for awards in the Any Sight 1600 but are not eligible for open tournament awards. Any Sight-Only competitors are not eligible to be State Champion.

Targets:

Official NRA Conventional targets will be used: A-23/5 at 50 yards, A-25 at 100 yards, and A-26 at 50 meters. Competitors will mark and hang their own targets before each match stage. Target clips are required and must be furnished by each competitor. Targets will be scored by the Statistical Office staff under the supervision of the Chief Statistical Officer. Scored targets will be available for inspection by competitors in the Statistical Office.

Challenges:

Challenges and protests will be addressed as described in Rule 16. A \$2.00 challenge fee will be charged for each challenge and collected by the Statistical Office before making the first recheck. The entire target will re-scored and the challenge fee will be returned if the challenge is sustained at any point along the line of rechecks. Challenges (including challenge fees) for fired matches must be submitted to the Match Director or Chief Statistical Officer before competitors are called to the line for the first stage of the next fired match. The challenge time limit for unfired matches is 30 minutes after the preliminary bulletin for the challenged unfired match is posted.

<u>Scoring Of Challenged Shots And Shots Of Questionable Value:</u> The plug type scoring gauge will be restricted to use by range operating personnel including range officers, chief statistical officer, and one or more of the three members of the jury who will be appointed by the Match Director.

Schedule Of Awards:

<u>State Champion:</u> The highest scoring individual resident competitor (other than Juniors and Any Sight-Only competitors) is the State Champion. The state champion will receive a State Champion award (plaque or trophy).

<u>Junior State Champion:</u> The highest scoring individual junior resident competitor (other than Any Sight-Only competitors) is the Junior State Champion. The Junior State Champion will receive a Junior State Champion award (plaque or trophy).

Match, Class, and Category Winners of individual matches, 1600 sub-aggregate matches, and 3200 grand aggregate match (other than junior competitors) will receive cash and/or award points. The value of awards will be based on an award schedule designed to equitably distribute awards to competitors based on the number of entries in each class and category. The total amount of funds available for awards distribution will be approximately 60% of total receipts less tournament expenses (NRA and GSSA registration fees, range fees, target costs, etc.).

A minimum of 5 entries is required to form a class and/or category. Second place awards will be presented with 8 or more entries in a class and/or category. Third place awards will be presented with 13 or more entries in a class and/or category. Classes with insufficient entries to meet the minimum entry criterion will be combined with a higher class (Rule 19.8.1).

We invite competitors and others to sponsor an individual match or matches or any special or fun award. Such sponsored awards will bear the name of the donor.
