

# 2017 New Hampshire State USA Shooting Junior Olympic Air Rifle Championship

Eligibility: This competition is open to all competitors born in 1996 or later. All competitors must be individual members of USA Shooting.

Residence: Each competitor may claim residence in only one state and must declare the state of residence on the entry form. Residents are eligible for the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place USA Shooting State Champion medallions. Residency is defined as to where the competitor holds a current and valid driver's license. If the competitor does not have a drivers license, residency is then defined as to where the competitor's parents/guardians reside. Non-residents may compete for invitations to the National Championship and are encouraged to do so. Non-residents are not eligible for state awards.

State Resident Qualifiers: USA Shooting will issue official invitations to the National Junior Olympic Shooting Championships (NJOSC) for the high scoring male and high scoring female resident from each State JOSC, provided they fire a minimum qualifying score. Resident collegiate and/or military competitors are eligible for the state resident champion awards and are also eligible for resident state qualifier invitations.

Entry: Only scores from a registered State Junior Olympic match will count for invitation to the National Junior Olympic Championships. Shooters **may not** compete in more than one state JOSC. Juniors who fire in their own home state JOSC will not be allowed to shoot in another state. Juniors from states which are not holding a state JOSC, and those who cannot attend their own state JOSC, will be allowed to enter as a non-resident in another state. Non-residents should declare their home state at entry and are not eligible for state resident awards.

Residency is defined as to where the competitor holds a current and valid driver's license. If the competitor does not have a drivers license, residency is then defined as to where the competitors parents/guardians reside.

- Categories: The following categories will be used for individual team competition:  
(Based on the age the competitor will be in the year 2017)
- Junior (J1); age 18-20; competitors born from 1997-1999
  - Intermediate Junior (J2); age 15-17; competitors born from 2000-2002
  - Sub-Junior (J3); age 14 & under; competitors born in 2003 or later.
- Classification: There will be no class based award schedule.
- Rules: **The 2014 edition** of USA Shooting Rules will govern.
- Course Of Fire: As per USA Shooting requirements:
- 15 minute preparation and sighting before match firing begins.
  - 60 shots men.
  - 40 shots women.
- Time Limit:
- 15 minute preparation and sighting before match firing begins.
  - Round one (Men and Women): 20 shots in 30 minutes.
  - Round two (Men and Women): 20 shots in 30 minutes.
  - Round three (Men only): 20 shots in 30 minutes.
- Firearm: Any 4.5 mm caliber air rifle conforming to USA Shooting rule 7.4.\*
- Sights: Metallic, USA Shooting rule 7.4.1.6
- Distance: 10 Meters
- Targets: AR5/10, 12 bulls (2 sighting) per target.
- Coaching: Coaching on the firing line will not be permitted.
- Scoring Protests: A scoring protest of \$1.00 per shot may be charged.
- Ties: All ties will be broken in accordance with USA Shooting Rules.
- Participation Pins: A Junior Olympic participation pin provided by USA Shooting will be given to each competitor.
- Awards: **Provided by USA Shooting** – USA Shooting will provide a gold medallion for the top resident individual, silver medallion for the 2<sup>nd</sup> place resident individual and a bronze medallion for the 3<sup>rd</sup> place resident individual.
- Score Sheets: **Special score sheets must be used for all State JOSCs.** They are to be filled in completely and signed by the competitor to be considered for invitation to the National JOSOC. **LEGIBLE** handwriting is required. If we cannot read your handwriting you may not get your invitation.
- Make Entry: Preliminary entries may be made via e-mail, phone or mail to the contact person shown at the top of the first page. However, entry will not be considered complete until payment has been received. The USA Shooting JOSOC Entry Form must be completed before firing begins.

- Entry Fees:
- A USA Shooting registration fee of \$10.00 per individual, per event will be charged and sent to USA Shooting with scores at the completion of the match.
  - A range fee of \$10.00 per competitor will be charged.
  - Total individual entry fee: \$20.00

Entries Close: Advance entries will close Wednesday, January 6th. Entries will be accepted to range capacity. Every effort will be made to accept all competitors who enter before the closing date.

Post Entries: Entries made after the closing date will be accepted up to range capacity. A post entry fee of \$5.00 will be charged.

Cancellations: Cancellations received one week in advance, or earlier, will receive a full refund.

- Events:
- Relays will be
- Relay 1: Thursday January 26th at 6:30PM
  - Relay 2 - Saturday January 28th at 12:30pm (sighters/prep), 12:45pm match start.
  - Relay 3 – Sunday January 29th at 12:30pm (sighters/prep) , 12:45pm match start.

The range will open one hour prior to the relay time. *Relay 1 on Thursday January 7th will only be held if there are at least 3 competitors a*

Preparation and sighting time will begin 15 minutes prior to the match start time. The range will open one hour prior to the relay time.  
*nd they cannot be squadded on Saturday 1/9 or Sunday January 10th.*

Range:

From the Everett Turnpike:  
Take Exit 2 off the Everett Tpk. and follow the signs towards Hudson going over the Merrimack River. After crossing the Merrimack stay in the right lane and turn onto Rt. 3A South (Sam's Club on right and Wal-Mart on left). At 3<sup>rd</sup> set of lights stay straight (right lane) to continue on Rt. 3A.  
Go about about 1½ miles to next lights. (Watch for HFGC sign.) Turn left at lights onto Pine Rd. Club is ¼ mile on left. Enter the building at the glass door entrance on the left.
